CLOSE UP of the tabletop of a bar, A SMALL MAN (SMALL), no more than 6 inches tall, walks onscreen and, after looking down for a moment to check his footing, which is off-camera, and kicks a lemon wedge that is near him. It flies through the frame and off-camera to the side.	SFX: a splat sound, something hitting the ground SMALL MAN (SMALL): It isn't easy being the littlest guy in the room. Mountains can LITERALLY be made out of mole hills getting across town is a daylong affair
A generic glass of beer is placed down next to SMALL	SMALL: and boy is it hard to get noticed amid the bigger folks
CUT TO different angle of the bar tabletop. SMALL turns his back to the glass of beer.	(offscreen) BAR DWELLER: Sorry didn't see you there
	SMALL: No worries dude Anyway, yeah. Being small can be tough. However, that doesn't mean it's bad. In fact, if you embrace it, suddenly a bunch of things can work in your favor
CUT TO initial close up of bar. The glass of beer is picked up and an order of fries that is far bigger than SMALL is placed down on the bar.	(offscreen) BARTENDER: Snack size fries, here ya go.
SMALL looks over at the fries and motions to them.	SMALL: For instance, that Also, when you're small you can be nimble. You can loosen up, have fun. You aren't weighed down down with the big issues your larger brethren may face.

CUT TO ESTABLISHING SHOT of the SLUMBREW BREWERY	SMALL: That's what's so great about Slumbrew. When they opened in 2011, they knew they would be a small player on the Boston brewery scene. But that's exactly what they wanted. I mean, they are a MICRO- brewery, right?
CUT TO SMALL standing on the bartop. He is on the left side of the screen, with a selection of Slumbrew beer cans lined up to his right.	SMALL: They aren't content with the same seasonal brews every year. Slumbrew likes to mix it up and experiment with new and interesting concepts, One of their beers was aged in a rum barrel. Another is a German sour ale with hibiscus, sea salt, and citrus! Interesting, right?
A HAND starts taking away the cans. SMALL motions to one of the cans	SMALL: Oh leave that one please? Thanks.
CUT TO a ESTABLISHING SHOT (potentially a TIME LAPSE) of the Assembly Row Beer Garden as the sun sets with Boston in view	SMALL: Now, five years later, Slumbrew is still proud to be one of Boston's most micro of breweries. Whether it's their brewery and taproom in Somerville, or their beer garden in Everett, when you grab a Slumbrew you get to enjoy it with the people who brew it.
CUT TO a bar table, where SMALL is standing next to the beer can that was left behind.	SMALL: So, next time you're out in that big bad world and carve a small piece of it for yourself, celebrate with a Slumbrew, and cheers to the little guys!
CUT TO LOGO and tagline: "Cheers to the little guys"
